2nd IPF University Classic Powerlifting World Cup Potchefstroom, South Africa Manager's Report

The 2nd IPF University Classic Powerlifting World Cup was held in Potchefstroom, South Africa from 9-15 July 2017, where 91 powerlifters from 28 universities from 13 countries competed. Team South Africa consisted of 10 powerlifters – 5 ladies and 5 men, competing under the South African Powerlifting Federation banner.

Here is the final #TeamSA medal count: the team won a total of 31 medals, and set 9 new SA National Junior records and 3 new SA National Open records. Highlights included UP lifter Francois Maritz winning the Best Male Lifter award, which is calculated on Wilk points across all weight divisions. Each of the SAPF lifters won at least one medal, and four SAPF students can now claim the title of 2017 World University Powerlifting Champion in their weight division, namely Rouxchelle Roux, Lezaan Jordaan, Marcel Vorster and Francois Maritz.

Best Lifter awards

South African lifter Francois Maritz was awarded the Best Male Lifter award for his impressive Wilks total of 470.48, beating Francis Ferriols from the Royal Melbourne Institute of Technology by 1.06 points.

Amongst the South African women lifters, Lezaan Jordaan, Megan Leighton and Rouxchelle Roux achieved Top 10 positions, ranking 6th, 7th and 9th respectively.
